Other Highlights for First Quarter 2023

- 23 Educational Programs were facilitated, with a total of 291 attending (excluding in-school 4-H Clubs).
- 4,302 direct in-person contacts (staff and volunteers)
- 149,507 total contacts (staff and volunteers)
- 197 Volunteer Hours were reported with a Value of \$5,900.00

4-H Youth Development

- Horse Judging Team (3 participants) and the Central Region Hippology Contest (Horse quiz bowl) (6 participants)
- Companion Animal Club (10 participants) 9 guest speakers
- Photography Club (7 participants) 1 volunteer (teacher)

Family And Consumer Sciences

A budgeting class was provided to parents of Head Start children as one of their required educational programs for the year. Eight teachers and parents participated in February.
